Greenwald started blogging about national security after 9/11. Based on his 2006 book, "How Would a Patriot Act?" he was strongly in support for the Iraq war and had wrote that "I had not abandoned my trust in the Bush administration".

or whether we will relinquish those values and fundamentally change who we are, all in the name of seeking protection from terrorism. I genuinely believe that we are extremely lucky to be the beneficiaries of a system of government that uniquely protects our individual liberties and allows us a life free of tyranny and oppression. It is incumbent upon all Americans who believe in that system, bequeathed to us by the founders, to defend it when it is under assault and in jeopardy. And today it is.

I did not arrive at these conclusions eagerly or because I was predisposed by any previous partisan viewpoint. Quite the contrary.

I first moved to Manhattan in 1991 to attend law school at New York University, and lived and worked there for the next fifteen years. Manhattan was my home and place of work on September 11, 2001. On that day, Manhattan felt like a nightmarish mix of war zone, police state, and anarchy all rolled into one. I don't know anyone whose outlook on politics wasn't altered in some meaningful way on that day. But soon we realized that our country, its institutions, and its people are strong enough to withstand any terrorist attack or any group of terrorists, and, for those who had not lost friends or family, life seemed to return to normal more quickly than anyone could have anticipated.

This is not to say that I was not angry about the attacks. I believed that Islamic extremism posed a serious threat to the country, and I wanted an aggressive response from our government. I was ready to stand behind President Bush and I wanted him to exact vengeance on the perpetrators and find ways to decrease the likelihood of future attacks. During the following two weeks, my confidence in the Bush administration grew as the president gave a series of serious, substantive, coherent, and eloquent speeches that struck the right balance between aggression and restraint. And I was fully supportive of both the president's ultimatum to the Taliban and the subsequent invasion of Afghanistan when our demands were not met. Well into 2002, the president's approval ratings remained in the high 60 percent range, or even above 70 percent, and I was among those who strongly approved of his performance.

What first began to shake my faith in the administration was its conduct in the case of Jose Padilla, a U.S. citizen arrested in May 2002 on U.S. soil and then publicly labeled "the dirty bomber." The administration claimed it could hold him indefinitely without charging him with any crime and while denying him access to counsel.

I never imagined that such a thing could happen in modern America—that a president would claim the right to order American citizens imprisoned with no charges and without the right to a trial. In China, the former Soviet Union, Iran, and countless other countries, the government can literally abduct its citizens and imprison them without a trial. But that cannot happen in the United States—at least it never could before. If it means anything to be an American citizen, it means that we cannot be locked away by our government unless we are charged with a crime, given due process in court, and then convicted by a jury of our peers.

I developed an intense interest in the Padilla case. It represented a direct challenge to my foundational political views—that we can tolerate all sorts of political disputes on a range of issues, but we cannot tolerate attacks by the government on our constitutional framework and guaranteed liberties.

My deep concerns about the Padilla case eroded but did not entirely eliminate my support for the president. The next significant item on the president's agenda was the invasion of Iraq. While the administration recited the standard and obligatory clichés about war being a last resort, by mid-2002 it appeared, at least to me, that the only unresolved issue was not whether we would invade but when the invasion would begin.

During the lead-up to the invasion, I was concerned that the hell-bent focus on invading Iraq was being driven by agendas and strategic objectives that had nothing to do with terrorism or the 9/11 attacks. The overt rationale for the invasion was exceedingly weak, particularly given that it would lead to an open-ended, incalculably costly, and intensely risky preemptive war. Around the same time, it was revealed that an invasion of Iraq and the removal of Saddam Hussein had been high on the agenda of various senior administration officials long before September 11.

Despite these doubts, concerns, and grounds for ambivalence, I had not abandoned my trust in the Bush administration. Between the president's performance in the wake of the 9/11 attacks, the swift removal of the Taliban in Afghanistan, and the fact that I wanted the president to succeed, because my loyalty is to my country and he was the leader of my country, I still gave the administration the benefit of the doubt. I believed then that the president was entitled to have his national security judgment deferred to, and to the extent that I was able to develop a definitive view, I accepted his judgment that American security really would be enhanced by the invasion of this sovereign country.

At some point he's worldview seemed to shift more towards anti-Americanism & he became increasingly critical of "mainstream media". Many have characterized Greenwald as being on the "political Left", but to be honest I don't even know what that means policy-wise these days.

Before becoming a journalist, Greenwald was working as a lawyer. In 1996, he co-founded his own law firm, Greenwald Christoph & Holland. The company focused on cases concerning issues of civil rights and the constitutional law of the US.

One of Greenwald's customers was neo-nazi Matthew Hale. Hale was the founder of the New Church of the Creator - a racist, holocaust-denying, homophobic religious movement. ## Civil Rights Group Sues White Supremacist Plans to use historic Anti-Klan Act to bankrupt Matt Hale

Elevating the profile of last July's racially-motivated shooting spree to still a higher level, the New York-based Center for Constitutional Rights has filed suit against the white supremacist group it claims is responsible for the two-state tear that left two dead and nine wounded.

In a federal lawsuit filed here Tuesday, lawyers for a Decatur pastor wounded during the spree allege World Church of the Creator leader Matthew F. Hale not only encouraged, but conspired with shooter Benjamin Nathaniel Smith to "commit wholesale acts of genocidal violence in furtherance of their self-proclaimed 'racial holy war' against any and all African-Americans, Jews, Asians and other ethnic groups."

Filed on the anniversary of the assassination of civil rights leader Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., the suit seeks unspecified actual and punitive damages from Hale, Smith's estate and the World Church of the Creator for the Rev. Stephen Anderson, a pastor of Greater Faith Temple Church who suffered three gunshot wounds July 3, 1999, while standing in the driveway of his home in Decatur.

Lawyers are suing under the Illinois Hate Crimes Act and the historic Anti-Klan Act, enacted in the 1870s to financially damage white supremacist organizations engaging in acts of terror, intimidation and violence.

The Center for Constitutional Rights has been involved in one other similar case. Back in 1982, in *Crumsey v. Justice Knights of the Ku Klux Klan*, the Center won a \$535,000 judgment against the Klan members for five Chattanooga women injured during a 1980 shooting spree.

This suit seeks to cause similar damage to Hale's organization, which seeks the deportation of all "mud races" from American soil.

"It is our hope, indeed it is our intention, to put Hale and his ilk out of business," said Pamela Armour, lead counsel in the Center's suit.

The Rev. Anderson was one of nine shot July 4th weekend by Smith, who killed two others before shooting himself to death as police closed in on him. Left dead were former Northwestern University basketball coach Ricky Byrdsong and Indiana University doctoral student Won Joon Yoon. All of the victims were black, Jewish or of Asian descent.

This is the second such suit filed against Hale, an Illinois bar applicant who has been denied a law license on moral fitness grounds.

Indeed the Center's suit appears to link Hale's rejection into the bar to Smith's "rampage." In late June, the state bar's Committee on Character and Fitness again denied Hale's petition to join the bar. Smith, who had testified as a character witness for Hale that April, began shooting two days later. "Immediately after the Illinois State Bar's decision and as part of the World Church of the Creator's war, Smith ... began a rampage of genocidal violence," the lawsuit states.

And while Hale himself has linked the shootings to his bar application in the past, he said Tuesday that it's ridiculous to think he had any control over Smith.

"Certainly I had a lot of contact with Ben Smith, I never denied that for one minute," Hale said. "If every lawyer who knows someone who commits a crime is a conspirator, the legal profession would cease to exist."

Hale's lawyer, New York attorney Glenn Greenwald, took a similar tact in responding to the suit.

"It's all just guilt by association," said Greenwald, who isn't sure yet whether he will be representing Hale on this latest federal action.

He did, however, seem interested in taking the case on. He compared it to the first suit, which alleged Hale ordered Smith to target minorities.

"All they can say Matt Hale did is express the view that Jews and blacks are inferior," he said. "There's just no question that expressing those views is a core First Amendment activity."

Further, Greenwald said, "I find that the people behind these lawsuits are truly so odious and repugnant, that creates its own motivation for me."

Glenn later on went and recorded interviews with witnesses without their knowledge or permission. Hale was arrested in Jan, 2003, for conspiring to murder a judge, and was sentenced to 40 years in prison, thus ending the collaboration between the two.

### MEMORANDUM OPINION AND ORDER

MORAN, Senior District Judge.

Defendants Matthew Hale, The World Church of the Creator, and the Estate of Benjamin Nathaniel Smith have filed objections to Magistrate Judge Ashman's resolution of this discovery dispute. See Fed.R.Civ.P. 72(a). Those objections are denied.

The magistrate judge's opinion, *Anderson v. Hale*, 202 F.R.D. 548 (N.D.Ill. 2001), thoroughly details the factual background, so we only summarize it here. Defendants' counsel recorded telephone conversations with various third party witnesses,



without disclosing to those witnesses that they were being recorded. Counsel and his tape-recorder were both in New York. The witnesses, at least some of them, called from Illinois. Plaintiff moved to compel disclosure of these tapes, arguing that this conduct was unethical and therefore vitiated any attorney workproduct privilege that may have attached to these recordings, and sought a protective order prohibiting any further recordings. The magistrate judge granted both motions, finding defense counsel's conduct unethical under two separate rules: Local Rule 83.58.4(a)(4), prohibiting "dishonesty, fraud, deceit or misrepresentation;" and Local Rule 83.54.4, stating "a lawyer shall not ... use methods of obtaining evidence that violate the legal rights of [another] person."

At the outset, we briefly address the timeliness issue. Defendants did not file their objections within the prescribed period. Nonetheless, we have discretion to consider the objections because this deadline is not jurisdictional. *Kruger v. Apfel*, 214 F.3d 784 (7th Cir.2000).

We review the magistrate judge's findings to determine whether they are "clearly erroneous or contrary to law." 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(1)(A). If the question requires an "unadulterated legal conclusion," we ordinarily perform a "more searching" review. See *McFarlane v. Life Ins. Co. of N. America*, 999 F.2d 266, 267 (7th Cir. 1993). Moreover, we have the discretion to conduct a *de novo* review. See *United States v. Frans*, 697 F.2d 188, 191 n. 3 (7th Cir.1983). Because this is a purely legal question, and one of tremendous importance, we will review this matter

Only in his early 20s, Jonathan Dubuque is already a successful and increasingly prolific porn producer. What makes Dubuque's success so striking is that he does not use - and does not even own - the items that the large XXX studios deem to be absolutely necessary for producing and marketing successful gay porn.

Dubuque uses no porn stars, scripts, costumes or plots; nor does the director instruct guys to act as the top or the bottom. He does not have teams of editors to incorporate the latest trendy editing techniques into his sex scenes, nor does he hire the large lighting, sound and camera crews who populate the set of every video made by the large studios.

What Dubuque does have - and, he will tell you, all he needs to make great porn - is a couple of digital video cameras, a set of lights and the ability to find "real" guys who have never before done porn and to persuade them to have uninhibited, wild, unscripted sex while Dubuque films it.

These days, Dubuque's straightforward, no-frills method of making porn is hardly unusual. To the contrary, the market for this type of porn is exploding. Just as reality television programs have overtaken fictionalized shows, consumers seem to be yearning for more reality porn like Dubuque's. As a growing number of people get their hands on digital cameras and are able to produce a flood of real sex videos, an entire industry is being created to provide an outlet for these videos.

*Sex tourism thrives in Rio thanks to popular saunas and legalized escorts*

Services are now popping up to help gay American travelers maximize their Rio adventures. Curtis Jacobs is a New Yorker who moved to Rio last year. His company, Rio Gay Guides ([RioGayGuides.com](http://RioGayGuides.com)), provides English-speaking male Brazilian guides to help Western tourists navigate Rio's sex and sauna scenes as well as to enjoy the city's ample non-sexual charms.

'Most people in Rio only speak Portuguese, so it helps to have a native guide to take you to the sights, find the right beaches and hidden restaurants, and help you find what you want in the saunas and clubs,' Jacobs says. 'Our guides make sure that the client doesn't get ripped off or fall into bad situations. The fact that our guides are hot and very open-minded about helping the tourist find what he wants makes them even more appealing.'

### Working Boy Saunas

Escorting in Brazil is legal. And jobs in Rio are scarce. Moreover, sexuality there is much more fluid than in the States, with the lines separating straight, bi and gay being blurry. As a result, guys of all types - from married policemen to college sophomores, gay, straight and bi - frequent the saunas.

Two of the most popular 'working boy' saunas are located in Copacabana - Point 202 and Estaco. The largest gay working sauna, by far, is Club 117, located in Gloria (next to downtown). It is sprawling, with more than 100 working guys during its peak hours. The saunas, usually open from 3pm till 2am, have bars, restaurants, dancing and entertainment. Their popular weekend drag shows attract a young crowd. And the spacious cabins include VCRs and large-screen TVs. It's more like an exciting sex club than, say, a dingy, depressing bathhouse.

### Passion for Passion

'Some tourists think that because a lot of the working guys are straight or bi, they will just go through the motions because they are doing it for the money,' Jacobs says. 'But that's not how Brazilians are. They are passionate people who are very open sexually, and they immerse themselves in all activities of pleasure'

## Glenn Greenwald resigns from the Intercept over 'editorial freedom'

Co-founder of news site accuses editors of seeking to censor article critical of Joe Biden

The investigative journalist Glenn Greenwald has resigned abruptly from the Intercept, the news website he co-founded, and accused the organization of seeking to censor him over a planned article critical of the Democratic nominee, [Joe Biden](#).

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Greenwald, who was a vital part of the Guardian US team that broke the Edward Snowden whistleblower story in 2013, released a [statement online](#) that blasted the editors of the Intercept as being in hock to Biden and the Democratic party.

In 2015, Greenwald suggested that the "the 'moderate' Free Syrian Army was largely a myth" and that the opposition was actually led by "various Al Qaeda manifestations and even more extreme elements". Glenn's source for this was Syrian Vice-Foreign Minister, Faisal Mekdad.



Hannity and Carlson. In their group text thread, Carlson pointed Hannity to a tweet by Fox reporter Jacqui Heinrich. Ex.230 at FNN035\_03890511. Heinrich was “fact checking” a tweet by Trump that mentioned Dominion—and specifically mentioned Hannity’s and Dobbs’ broadcasts that evening discussing Dominion. Ex.232; Ex.231. Heinrich correctly fact-checked the tweet, pointing out that “top election infrastructure officials” said that ““There is no evidence that any voting system deleted or lost votes, changed votes, or was in any way compromised.”” *Id.*; Ex.232.

Carlson told Hannity: “Please get her fired. Seriously....What the fuck? I’m actually shocked...*It needs to stop immediately, like tonight. It’s measurably hurting the company. The stock price is down. Not a joke.*” Ex.230 at FNN035\_03890511. Tucker added: “I just went crazy on Meade over it.” *Id.* at FNN035\_03890512. Hannity said he had “already sent to Suzanne with a really?” He then added: “I’m 3 strikes. Wallace shit debate[,] Election night a disaster[.]

Now this BS? Nope. Not gonna fly. Did I mention Cavuto?” *Id.*

From "the American left's most fearless political commentator" to "bomb-throwing media-critic", these days Glenn visits often Carlson's show (between 2017-2021 he was a guest 40 times) and shares content by figures like Jack Posobiec, Matt Gaetz and Marjorie Taylor Greene.
